"The Federal Security Agency, Office of Community War Services, through its Recreation Division, is charged with the responsibility for war recreational problems and the basic task of helping communities in the organization of recreation in war time. Defense Recreation Committees, a part of local defense councils, are the instruments through which all recreational resources—public and private—are urged to clear. The Recreation Division, Federal Security Agency, is responsible for co-operating with all agencies, including the United Service Organizations, Inc., in making programs effective in localities where their services can contribute to the general needs which cannot be met locally."

In Greenville, as construction of the Army camp begin in August, 1942, the initiative for meeting prospective needs was taken by the Greenville Council of Defense, Mr. M. A. Blair, chairman, and the Defense Recreation Committee, headed by Mr. John B. Stoeber.

THE USO COUNCIL

"The USO, which is a national voluntary organization providing services to service men, is formed by six private welfare groups—YMCA, YWCA, National Catholic Community Service, Jewish Welfare Board, Salvation Army and National Traveler's Aid Society. The program of the USO is one segment of the total community program, and should be incorporated as a part of a total war program. It provides personnel and maintains clubhouses to serve the social, educational and welfare needs of the men."

The Greenville USO Council was organized in December, 1942, with Mr. Frank L. Fay as chairman, and has been operating the Clinton street USO Club since its dedication May 9, 1943. More than 200,000 service men and their guests have used the facilities of the club from that date to the present.
