GREENVILLE—The Methodist Church, 71 Clinton Street, is being used temporarily as the center for U. S. O. activities in Greenville, pending establishment of permanent quarters. The center offers a lounge, reading and writing rooms.

Club activities that cannot be held in a church will be held in auxiliary quarters.

SHARON—The Buhl Boys' Club, 293 E. State Street, is headquarters for the U. S. O. in Sharon.

The facilities of this club include lounge rooms, a gymnasium, shower rooms, bowling alleys, billiard and ping pong rooms and limited space for dancing.

Large U. S. O. dances are held at the Buhl Girls' Club, 49 Walnut Street.

SOME HISTORICAL NOTES
about the
SHENANGO PERSONNEL
REPLACEMENT DEPOT



THE name "Shenango" is of Indian origin and is a corruption of "Ochenango," meaning "large bull thistles."

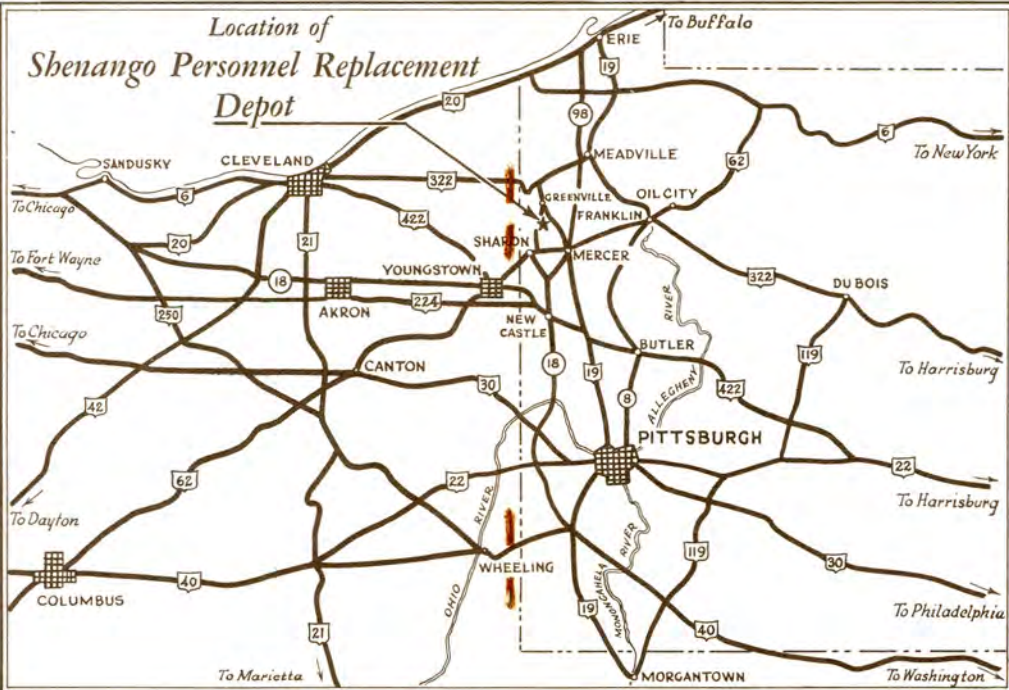
On October 13, 1792, Anthony Wayne marched near the site of the present Shenango Personnel Replacement Depot where he found a camp which he fortified and called "Fort Greenville." Here he remained throughout the winter sending out scouts against the Indians.

In May of the following year, General Wayne set out from this vicinity and marched nearly 400 miles through enemy country to defeat an Indian force of two thousand.

On August 3, 1795, General Wayne returned to Fort Greenville to meet with the representatives of the twelve Indian tribes and establish a peace which made possible the settlement of Ohio, Illinois and the great West by the white man.

Ground was broken for the present Shenango Personnel Replacement Depot in July, 1942.

OUT-OF-TOWN CALLS

There are two kinds of out-of-town calls. It's a **station-to-station** call when you merely ask the operator to connect you with a telephone in another city. (If you don't know the number, give the operator the address and tell her you'll talk with anyone.)

It's a **person-to-person** call if you ask the operator to connect you with some specified person, or an extension telephone, room or department reached through someone's private switchboard.

On station-to-station calls, faster service is possible and rates are lower than on person-to-person calls, but the charges start as soon as anyone answers the called telephone.

So it's best to use the cheaper, faster station-to-station service when you're reasonably sure the person you want to reach will be at or near the telephone when you call.

Reduced Night Rates—on calls where the station-to-station day rate is more than 35 cents—start at 7 P. M. (to 4:30 A. M.) and the same reductions are in effect all day Sunday.

There May Be Delays

Millions of men like you, in camps throughout the country, are keeping in touch with home by telephone. Add these calls to the official calls of the Army and Navy, the calls of war industries and the usual civilian calls and you have a staggering volume.

Telephone circuits are heavily overloaded. We can't add to them because that would take critical metals and materials needed for the war. So a call of yours may be delayed.

We're sorry if this happens but we know you will understand why.

Telephone Tips

If the operator tells you there will be a delay on your call, please leave the booth until you are called back. Others waiting to use the telephone will appreciate it if you keep your call short.
